To All Applicants:

If you are interested in working for a Police Department in a growing city that is dedicated to constant improvement, please take a moment to read further.

The Lebanon Police Department offers a challenging patrol area with a resident population of approximately 13,000. During the daytime, the population increases to approximately 35,000 due to the local economic and social activity of the area. We cover this area with 33 sworn officers and a total Police Department staff of approximately 50 people. We are very active and enjoy the support of the residents of the City of Lebanon.

The Lebanon area offers the best of northern New England and is located adjacent to the crossroads of I-89 and I-91 with I-89 running through the middle of the City. Lebanon Police Officers can live in the City or within 45 minutes of the station.

With a newly appointed police chief, the Lebanon Police Department believes in utilizing contemporary and progressive policing practices. This includes a problem-oriented approach to policing and a dedicated effort toward community engagement. We provide and utilize modern equipment, which is constantly being upgraded and improved, so that we can provide a first rate service to our community.

Our Patrol Officers' base pay for 2016 is \$51,480 to \$62,108 and they are members of the New Hampshire State Retirement System, which permits retirement at age 50 or 25 years of service, whichever is later, for newly certified officers. ***Certified officers may be started at a higher rate based upon experience.***

Full-Time Certified Officers will be paid a bonus of \$5,000 upon being hired!!
(3 year employment agreement required)

Officers in our employ are eligible for a number of specialty assignments based upon performance and experience. These assignments include a police K-9 Unit, which currently has two teams, full-time School Resource Officer, SWAT trained Tactical Containment Team, Field Training Officer Program, Accident Reconstruction, Firearms and Use of Force Instructors, Rape Aggression Defense Program (R.A.D.), and a Mountain Bike Patrol Unit. Additionally, officers may work toward assignments in our Detective or Training Division along with various promotional opportunities.
