TOWN OF COVENTRY ANNOUNCES THE APPLICATION PROCESS P.O.S.T. CERTIFIED POLICE OFFICERS

The Coventry Police Department is accepting applications from individuals who have already received certification as a police officer from the Police Officers Commission of Standards and Training (P.O.S.T.).

For those individuals who are not current police officers, applications will be accepted from qualified individuals who have retired from law enforcement service within the last three (3) years; who are currently certified by the RI P.O.S.T. and who have retired in good standing.

Out of state certified police officers must provide police academy transcripts documenting that the academy attended is a P.O.S.T. certified academy. Also applicants must have completed at least one year of continuous service as a certified police officer and have completed the probation period at their current department.

In addition, all lateral applicants <u>must</u> provide a letter of good standing from the Chief of Police of their previous department at the time of application.

All previous applicants must re-apply.

About Us

The Coventry Police Department consists of 57 sworn officers and is supported by a professional staff of 17 employees. We provide law enforcement services to a population of approximately 36,000 residents who reside within 64 square miles. Our community is unique in that the eastern part of town is densely populated and our western section is rural.

Qualifications

Individuals who wish to be considered for employment by the Town of Coventry as a Police Officer must, at the time of application, be a US Citizen; have an active driver's license; and pass all testing requirements, including oral interviews, background investigation, psychological test, and a medical examination.

How to Apply

Completed applications must be submitted via PoliceApp.com.

Candidates MUST possess a valid driver's license for entry into all phases of the selection process.

The Coventry Police Department is an Equal Opportunity Employer. Qualified applicants are considered for employment without regard to race, color, gender, national origin, disability, or veteran status, or any other legally protected status. Minority and female candidates are strongly encouraged to apply.

Selection Process

The applicants meeting the minimum basic requirements must successfully complete the following phases of the selection process. Testing dates, times, & location that are not listed will be emailed to qualified applicants:

- 1. Oral Boards Interview
- 2. Intensive Background Investigation
- 3. Interview with Chief
- 4. Psychological Examination
- 5. Medical Examination
